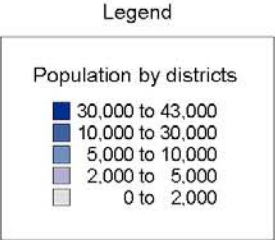
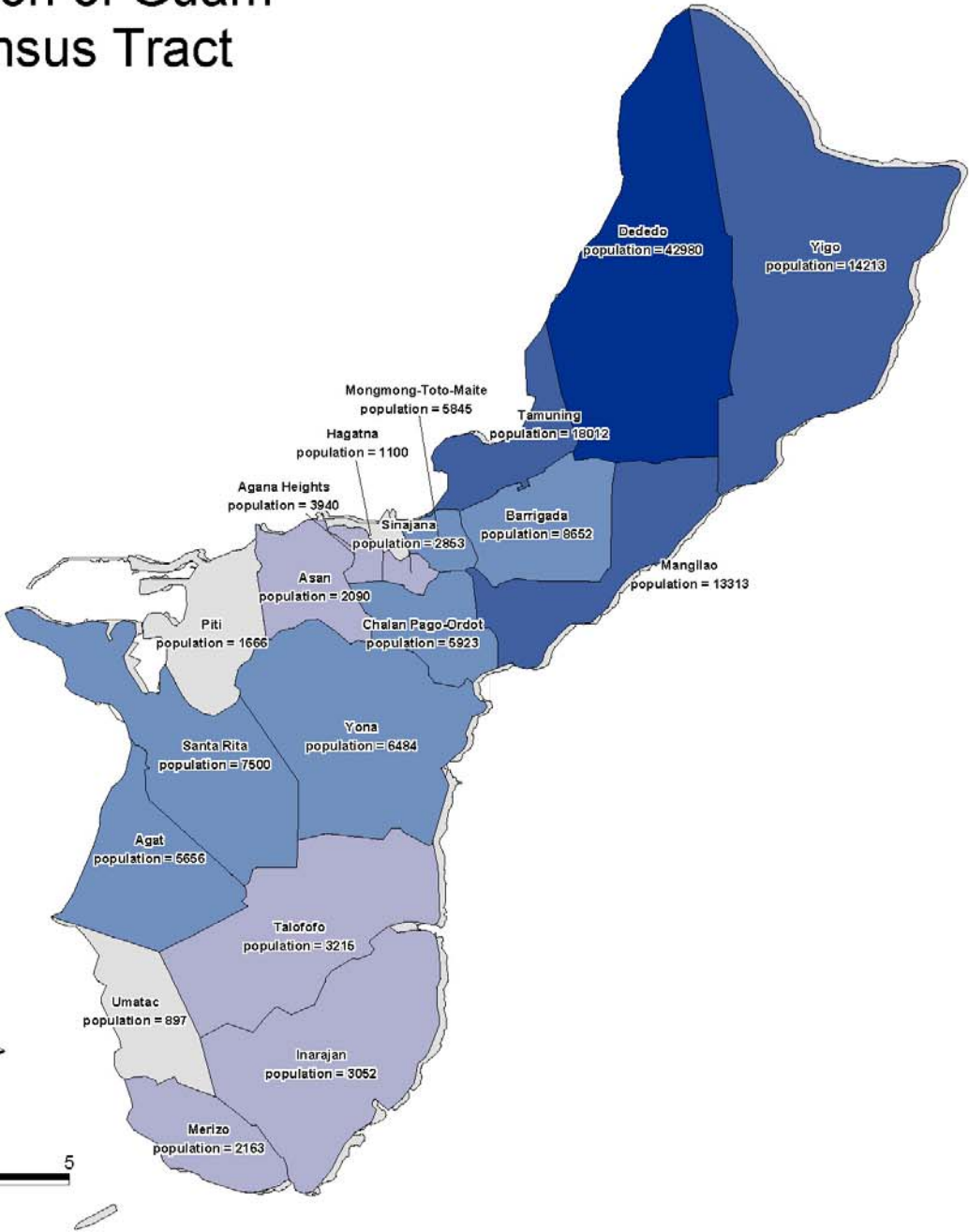

State Information - Guam

- ARC: Single State Regional Chapter
- Maintains a Mutual Aid Agreement with the NMI Chapter.

Guam Demographics

- Estimated at 154,805 people (2000 census).
- 10,509 active duty military personnel and their dependents.
- Monthly tourist average of 90,000 visitors.
- According to the 2000 U.S. Census, approximately 1,700 people do not speak English.

Guam 96-Hour Timeline

- All islands are considered at risk at Landfall minus 96 hours
- H-96
 - Initiate contact with DOC.
 - Call volunteers and appraise them of the situation and to be on standby. Information will be disseminated to volunteers as it becomes available.
 - Issue press release encouraging public to go over their emergency supplies and replenish as needed.
- H-72
 - Contact the Public School System and encourage them to go over their shelter supply kits and make sure that all necessary items are in place. If not, ARC will assist in procurement of needed items.
- H-48
 - Send liaison to Civil Defense for briefing.
- H-24
 - Staff EOC.

Key Challenges for Guam

- Currently without an ESD. 4 Paid staff members
- The local chapter lacks the depth within its volunteer base to respond efficiently in a large operation, and must continue to actively recruit volunteers
- Logistical issues due to time zone and geographical location from mainland counterparts
- Technological infrastructure

Guam Successes

- The Chapter has adequate supplies and human resources to provide services to a level 2 or small 3 operation.
- Government Employees who are ARC Volunteers are allowed up to 15 days to assist with Disaster Relief Operations.
- Close working relationship with local government and military officials.
- Disaster training is continuously being offered in the villages.

Guam Shelters

The Guam Public School System (PSS) has responsible for:

- **providing Mass Care Sheltering, either in PSS facilities or other government designated shelters;**
- **assigning government shelter managers to the shelters;**
- **providing transportation for evacuees to and from the shelters.**

Guam Service Delivery

- **Requirements:** EOC, Disaster Assessment, Casework, Bulk Distribution
- **Shortfalls:** EOC/Gov't relations, Casework Supervision, Caseworkers, Operations Management

Guam Shortfalls

- Chapter has adequate supplies and human resources to provide services to a Level 2 or small Level 3 operation.
- Level 4 or 5 will require additional out-of-jurisdiction support.
- Chapter DFSC supplies and mutual aid agreement will be activated immediately during a large event to support Chapter relief operations.
